A) The purpose of this amendment is to remove the following requirement listed under Section I CLAUSES, FAR Clause 52.212-2 EVALUATION—COMMERCIAL ITEMS (JAN 1999), (1) Technical Capability and under Section L REPRESENTATIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS, L-1 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS, Technical Factors:

Provide resumes for at least three (3) personnel that will report to the Quality Manager.

B) Section 7.4.1 METHOD BLANK will be modified to reflect the following: The concentration of all target analytes will be less than two times the method detection limit, or 10 percent of the regulatory limit for that compound, or 10 percent of the measured concentration in the sample. Also, USACE will provide regulatory limits for task orders on a case-by-case basis.

C) In addition, responses are listed below to the following questions that have been asked regarding Solicitation No. W912BU-04-R-0010:

1) MDL study for method 8260B. Do you want the submittal to include the raw data or just the results from the 7 replicates and the calculated MDLs?

-- USACE requests only the summary results for the MDL study, including statistics. The quantity of sample used should also be included, as well as purge volumes.

2) Section 7.4.1. Is the regulatory limit our internal PQLs or will the lab be provided specific detection limits? Does the 5% requirement mean plus or minus 5% of the PQL (value), or 5% of the PQLs?

-- Lab will be provided specific detection limits. See B) above for changes to the Scope of Work.

3) Line Items 0003 and 0010 specify OLM03.2. Section 1.2, Item 7 specifies that the latest SW-846 or CLP methods are to be used, which would be OLM04.2. Should we provide prices for OLM03.2 or OLM04.2?

-- Please use latest methods (OLM04.2 in this case)

4) For some line items, multiple digestion/preparation methods are referenced. For example, Item 0037 lists Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons: Diesel Range using methods 3510C, 3520C, 3540C, 3550B, 3580A/8015B (mod). Does the laboratory need to be able to perform all of the methods listed or can any one of the methods be used?

-- It would be nice if the laboratory could run all procedures, but they can only price what they can do. If they do not run a required extraction procedure, they will have to subcontract.

5) Who will pay shipping charges for return of samples to the laboratory?

-- If a courier is not dispatched from the lab to pick up the samples, USACE may either drive the samples to the lab or take them to a shipper such as FedEx. Method of transport will depend on several factors including site location, lab location, time of day, etc. If USACE takes the samples to FedEx, USACE will pay for shipping.

6) It has been indicated that a local courier is preferred. Can you explain the logistics behind how samples will be taken in the field and then shipped to the laboratory?

-- USACE will collect samples or be given samples by contractors at jobsite. A decision will be made prior to the start of the field work on method of sample transport or pickup. If the field work plan includes pickup by the lab,

this will usually involve pickup at a certain time and place previously agreed on by USACE and the lab. Ability to provide same day pickup or dropoff by lab can also provide added capability with respect to collection of additional unexpected samples, etc.

D) Any contract resulting from this solicitation shall incorporate these changes.

E) The closing date of 24 February 2004 remains unchanged.
